WOMEN IN SEAFOOD 2023

2023 was an incredible year for our organisation. We saw substantial growth in our membership and with so many activities and events, we are engaging more and more with with our members. WISA's growth driven by the commitment and support by our Board of Directors, WISA staff and partners and, of course, our members.

A highlight of 2023 was World Aquaculture in Darwin where WISA had a strong presence. Thanks to ACIAR, we provided bursary opportunities for aquaculture women both nationally and internationally. WISA delivered our Breaking Barriers workshop identifying and discussing solutions to gendered barriers in aquaculture, hosted a panel discussion, and officially launched our Turn the Tide Project.

Thanks to funding from the Department of Prime Minister and Cabinet, 62 women participated in the first year of our Turn the Tide (T3) Project across 2 new exciting programs - Mentoring and Entrepreneurship & Leadership. And over 500 industry members attended WISA events! After an inspiring inaugural year, we are excited for 2024. Breaking Barriers is designed to provide women within the Australian seafood industry development and growth opportunities at a personal level, tailored to their individual needs, career paths and ambition. The Breaking Barriers workstream comprises three main programs.

2024 MENTOR PROGRAM

Each year of Turn the Tide, we are running a free facilitated Mentor Program to help women progress in their careers in the seafood industry. The online program is 12 months.

The program matches women at all stages of their careers with mentors. The mentoring pairs are provided with skills sessions and materials to ensure the mentoring relationship is productive and supportive. The Turn the Tide team will also be with you to support you along the way.
