ENTREPRENEUR AND LEADERSHIP PROGRAM 2023 APPLICATIONS EXTENDED

The Turn the Tide Entrepreneurship and Leadership program is designed to train women in entrepreneurial and leadership thinking to solve key issues faced in workplaces and communities.

The program will take participants through a process of shared problem identification, collectively developing practical and measurable actions and tools to address the problem, and then implementing these. Affectus, WISA and identified experts will support participants action plan development and implementation.

Key outcomes for participants on program completion will be entrepreneurial and leadership thinking and skills, as well as a process for collective action, to take into their work and personal lives.

An awesome bonus is that participants will walk away with a new support network and relationships with a diverse group of women in seafood, and connections to industry leaders and influencers.

The issue/s that each group will address are topics that directly impact all women in the seafood industry. WISA and Affectus believe that through understanding and applying the concept of leadership and change through entrepreneurial thinking, it will be possible to tackle and affect change.

Potential topics;

- · Building a career while juggling the additional "women's work" of family and caring responsibilities
- · Developing skills and strategies to build, manage and grow your business as a woman in a male dominated workplace
- · Navigating the network: Overcoming exclusion and isolation from the existing network to break through the "glass ceiling"
- · Raising the visibility of, and opportunities for, women in leadership
- · Developing strategies and tools for all women to ensure physical and psychological safety in the industry
- · Growing deeper and stronger connections, teams and networks among seafood women to build resilience and opportunity (with WISA, across the industry)
- · Developing resources and your voice to overcome undermining language and behaviours and unconscious bias in the workplace (calling it out!)
- · Growing industry awareness of women's contribution to industry through entrepreneurship and leadership stories
- \cdot Building strategies, tools and ideas for increasing the confidence of women
- · Engaging all of industry to listen to women: Developing strategies and communications to build allies (leaders, men, women) to champion cultural change

SEXUAL HARASSMENT **WORKPLACE LAW REFORM**

From 13 December 2023, new laws imposing a 'positive duty' to take real and meaningful action in relation to sexual harassment will impact all Australian organisations. An important starting place for taking necessary action is to ensure that all individuals:

- · Understand what sexual harassment is- and what it is not;
- Have opportunities to explore the ways that sexual harassment can impact dignity and safety; and
- · Are equipped and ready to respond to sexual harassment in ways that uphold dignity and build on safety.
