BREAKING THE BARRIERS: INDUSTRY FINDINGS

WISA have completed an industry report identifying key issues for women in the Aquaculture and Seafood Industry. At the Breaking Barriers workshop held at the World Aquaculture Conference in Darwin. The group workshopped and shared experiences as to what has prevented women from reaching their full potential in the industry.

Barriers identified included:

- · Family and caring responsibilities
- A "Boy's Club" network excluding women.
- The lack of visibility of women in leadership
- · A lack of confidence in women
- The use of undermining language



NEW BIOSECURITY PROTECTION LEVY

A new Biosecurity Protection Levy on all domestic agriculture, fisheries and forestry producers was announced in the last budget.

The levy commenced on 1 July 2024 - it is intended to collect around \$50 million per year for the Commonwealth biosecurity funding in 2024-25.
